# Helping people <u>Know</u>, <u>Grow</u> and <u>Go</u> in Christ's Love

Frances Curry, Sam Davidson, Bob Dollison, Adam Polley, Teresa Riffle, Rick Withers and Team Leader Cathy Marck climbed into the church van on June 9 and headed to Whiteville, North Carolina on a work team mission trip. They returned on June 16.

This is where they helped people **Know**, **Grow** and **Go** in Christ's Love, our church's mission statement. The team repaired two homes damaged by Hurricane Florence on

September 14, 2018. This hurricane brought 90 mph winds, heavy rainfall resulting in flooded homes.

On June 23 the Whiteville mission team shared their experiences with the church congregation. The team thanked the congregation for this opportunity and support through prayers, finances or working on fundraisers.

**Team Leader Cathy Marck** said, "Thank you to our prayer partners and to the church. We felt and knew you were praying for us. Thank you to those who gave, participated and supported this mission with your finances and your time." She went on to say that the team felt God's blessings and found unity with one another. Cathy shared, "After returning from the ER (she went with Bobby), to the work site, worried because they were down one man plus me, but the ceiling was finished! God had worked this out! "

**Bobby Dollison** shared that this was his first mission trip, "I could never go on a mission team before due to work. It was the most amazing thing I have ever done." He said that he was just being himself, doing whatever he could do and praising the Lord for it. Each day before the workday began, they prayed and could "feel God's spirit day after day." Bobby said, "I realized that work can be fun, people helping people."

"At first when I heard that we were working with Samaritan's Purse, I had no idea that they helped in rebuilding," stated **Teresa Riffle,** "I thought of the Shoebox Ministry." She continued, "There are two phases of this ministry: disaster relief (for clean-up) and rebuild team (for rebuilding at no cost to the homeowner). Teresa said that she prayed for good weather where the team could work and God provided. She said, "Betty, a lady that we worked on her home, was a real blessing to me. She told us how we were a blessing to her, but Betty was a real blessing to me." (continued on page 2)

**Frances Curry** clearly stated, "It was a blessing to all of us, I would go again, if asked." She along with many of the other team members, she spoke of Betty and how blessed she felt.

For **Rick Withers**, this was his first mission trip. He said, "It was challenging the first couple of days, the devil was working against me but I am glad I stayed."

"The days seemed to go slow but on Friday, I wondered where the week went," shared **Adam Polley**. He too spoke of Betty and how she showed us several medals she had won at the North Carolina Senior Olympics. He went on to say, "We repaired her ceiling and we surprised her with a new ceiling fan." Adam asked that we continue to pray for the people of North Carolina, they are still hurting.

#### Sam Davidson told the

congregation, "Eating lunch with Grover and his wife, I truly felt God's spirit." He recalled, "When Bobby fell, the EMT in me kicked in. After checking him out, we called the squad. Then I had to take a moment asking God why I was there. God told me for this moment, that's why I was there."

Helping people **Know**, **Grow** and **Go** in Christ's Love (our church's mission statement)...that is just what this work team did.

## Comfy corner creations

Our missionaries, Steve and Debbie Cartwright at the Southwest Indian Ministries in their March 2019 Cartwright Chronicle, shared verses of scripture pertaining to using the ministry of food and fellowship. Andrew and Megan Hottinger are incorporating a similar idea into their ministry at the Williamsport church. Knowing we all need a healthy dose of vegetables, I lovingly and carefully submit, a third historic pie recipe. It is a little more involved, but will yield eww's and ahh's from even the pickiest eater. Several variations are included. Enjoy!

#### **HOOSIER CREAM PIE**

One 9-inch pie

3/4 cup sugar

½ cup cornstarch

½ teaspoon salt

2 ½ cups whole milk or half 'n half

3 egg yolks, beaten slightly

2 Tablespoons butter

2 teaspoons vanilla



Baked Pie Shell (9-inch)

Combine first 3 ingredients in heavy sauce-pan and stir in milk or half 'n half. Cook over low heat until thickened, stirring constantly. Simmer gently for 5 minutes and remove from heat. Beat one-third of the hot mixture into egg yolks, then stir into remaining hot mixture. Cook over low heat for 1 minute, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and stir in butter and vanilla. Cool for 10 minutes, stirring often.

Pour into baked pie shell and cool on wire rack. Serve plain or top with fresh fruit, such as raspberries or sliced peaches and whipped cream.

#### Variations:

**Vanilla Meringue Pie:** Top Hoosier Cream Pie with Basic 3-Egg meringue. Brown.

**Banana Cream Pie:** use 2 ripe bananas, peeled and sliced. Fill pie shell with alternate layers of partially cooled Hoosier Cream Pie filling and thin banana slices, starting and ending with filling. Chill and garnish with sweetened whipped cream or top with Basic 3-Egg Meringue and brown.

**Chocolate Meringue Pie:** Increase sugar to 1 cup and add 3 squares (ounces) unsweetened chocolate to milk before cooking. Top with Basic 3-Egg Meringue and brown.

**Coconut Cream Pie:** Stir 1 cup flaked coconut into cream filling with butter and vanilla. Top with Basic 3-Egg Meringue. Sprinkle 1/3 cup coconut over meringue and brown as directed for basic meringue.

**Basic 3-Egg Meringue:** 3 egg whites, ¼ teaspoon cream of tartar, ½ teaspoon vanilla, 1/3 cup sugar. Combine first 3 ingredients in beater bowl and beat until egg whites are foamy. Add sugar gradually, 1 Tablespoon at a time and beat until sugar is dissolved and whites are stiff, glossy and hold soft peaks. Spread carefully over a hot or warm filling, sealing it securely to edges of crust. Bake in moderate oven, 375 degrees, about 12 to 15 minutes, or until meringue is attractively browned. Cool on wire rack away from drafts.
