

How to Delight in God's Loving Laws ~ Excerpt from **Parenting Christian Kids**





The words "love" and "law" are rarely are used in the same sentence these days. Yet the Old Testament psalmists express great delight in God's commands: "Oh, how I love your law! I

meditate on it all day long" (Psalm 119:97) and "See how I love your commandments, Lord. Give back my life because of your unfailing love" (verse 159). In the New Testament, Jesus also connects the concepts of love and obedience to the law. In John 14:15, he tells his followers, "If you love me, obey my commands." Love is at the "heart" of all God's laws, from the Ten Commandments in Exodus 20 to the two great commandments Jesus gives: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your strength and with all your mind" and "Love your neighbor as yourself" (Luke 10:27). The golden rule—"Do to others as you would like them to do to you." (Luke 6:31)—also is based on love. As with any rule or law, we humans repeatedly fall short when it comes to obedience. That's why it's important to emphasize the forgiveness that Jesus freely offers to us-and that we are to freely offer to other people. Throughout the Bible, it's clear that disobedience is serious and has big consequences. Yet our loving God longs to forgive us, restore us, and reconcile us to himself.

- 1. To give you hearts willing to obey God and his commands.
- 2. To show your family that obedience brings blessings, not
- 3. To help you lovingly obey other authority figures.

Love means doing what God has commanded us. and he has commanded us to love one another, just as you heard from the beginning. 2 John 1:6





Comfy corner creations

As with many recipes, there are so many varieties it is hard to select just one. But, hopefully, I've picked a recipe most people will like as we continue the soup category for these colder days and evenings. Enjoy!

Minestrone with Pasta and Beans

3 Tablespoons olive oil

4 ounces cubed pancetta (or bacon)

2 or 3 celery stalks, finely chopped

3 medium carrots, finely chopped

1 medium onion, finely chopped

1 or 2 garlic cloves, crushed

1 can (14 oz.) chopped tomatoes

4 cups chicken stock

1 can (14 oz.) cannellini beans, drained and rinsed

½ cup short-cut macaroni

2 to 4 tablespoons chopped fresh flat-leaf parsley

Salt and ground pepper

Shaved Parmesan cheese, to serve

Gently heat the oil on low in a large saucepan; add the pancetta and fry for a moment to release some of the fat, then add the celery, carrots and onions. Cook for about 5 minutes, stirring constantly with a wooden spoon. Stir until vegetables are tender but not too soft.

Add the garlic and tomatoes, breaking them up well with a wooden spoon. Pour in the stock. Add salt and pepper to taste and bring to a boil. Half cover the pan, reduce the heat and simmer gently for about 20 minutes, until all the vegetables are soft.

Add the drained beans to the pan with the macaroni. Bring to a boil again. Cover, lower the heat and continue to simmer for about 20 more minutes. Check the consistency and add more stock if necessary. Stir in the parsley and taste for seasoning.

Serve hot, sprinkled with plenty of shaved Parmesan cheese.

CFC...Our brief history

The denomination of the Churches of Christ in Christian Union continued to grow. By 1915 we had forty churches; the establishment of the Mount of Praise Holiness Camp in 1917 and by 1925, 60 churches were part of our denomination.

With the start of Mount of Praise Camp, people came from all over...West Virginia, Tennessee, Kentucky, Indiana and Michigan. One camp meeting the evangelists were Dr. John L. Brasher and Dr. John Church.

Dr. John Church wrote, "For the past 35 years I have travelled up and down and back and forth across the nation and preached in many camps, but I have never seen any greater manifestation of praise and joy that I have found at this camp.

On one occasion the Spirit of God came upon the people and they shouted the praise of God for more than an hour. I would make an altar call and the altar would fill up with people. Then they would pray with these seekers through and another wave would sweep the crowd...then another break would come and the altar would fill up with seekers again. Dr. Brasher, one of my co-workers at this camp, turned to me and commented as we watched the people shout and rejoice, 'Church, I imagine that this is something like it was on the day of Pentecost, when the fire fell.'"

That is the Mount of Praise, the general camp meeting of the Churches of Christ in Christian Union. Glorious in its legacy, wonderful in its power, bright in its future. It has made a major contribution to the history of the church and our denomination.

In 1928, the denomination built a new and bigger tabernacle just down the hill from the old tabernacle. (This is now the front parking lot of PICCA). The old tabernacle was transformed into the kitchen and dining room for the campers. The first wood dorm was built and Rev. O.L. Ferguson and work crew was contacted to build three cottages. The dorm and cottages were built in back of the new tabernacle.

With the growth of the camp, our church continued to host the general council meetings and was able to host several revivals with key note speakers such as Dr. John L. Brasher, Dr. John Church, the Fleming Brothers (John and Bona) and Percy Trueblood. Also, the denomination gained several evangelists for the Churches of Christ in Christian, Rev. Donovan Humble, Rev. Charles Williams, Rev. Grayson Ferguson, Rev. G.C. Johnson, Rev. Melvin Truex Sr, just to name a few.

Also, through the years they began to make plans to bring the publishing and print shop to Circleville and to start a school for the training of young ministers.
