Yard Sale Operation Christmas Child August 15

Comfy corner creations

Happy Summer Everyone! We've been dealing with quick breads and now it will be fun to move onto yeast breads! Wow! As with quick breads what an exciting area to explore! Recipes are everywhere. Here's one of the simplest yeasted bread recipes I've found and will delight everyone who partakes of it. I've printed it before, but it bears repeating. Enjoy!

ENGLISH MUFFIN BREAD

2 ½ to 3 cups all-purpose flour 1 package instant yeast 1 Tablespoon sugar ¾ teaspoon salt 1 ¼ cups water Cornmeal



In a large bowl, combine 1 cup of the flour and the yeast. In saucepan heat 1 ½ cups water, sugar and salt until warm. Stir to dissolve the sugar. Add to dry mixture in bowl. Beat at low speed with electric mixer for ½ minute, scraping bowl.

Beat 3 minutes at high speed. By hand, stir in enough remaining flour to make a soft dough. Shape into ball. Place in a lightly greased bowl; turn once to grease surface. Cover; let rise until double, about an hour. Punch down.

Cover; let rest 10 minutes. Grease a round 1-quart casserole; sprinkle with cornmeal. Place dough in casserole; sprinkle top with cornmeal. Cover; let rise till double (30 to 45 minutes). Bake at 400 degrees for 40 to 45 minutes, or around 190 to 200 degrees internal temperature. Cover loosely with foil if top browns too quickly. Remove from dish; cool. Makes 1.

Purses with a purpose

Before COVID-19, **Terra Neff** brought a ministry before the church congregation, the idea is to provide toiletry items to young ladies with a goal of 250 purses.



"There are so many people around us that need help. They need just the basics and now that I know the issue is all around, I want to help. This is very important because the high schoolers in our local schools need help. But also, to know that the churches around them love them and will support them," said Terra.

So, what is needed? Toiletry items such as shampoo, conditioner, body wash, deodorant, toothbrushes, toothpaste and personal hygiene products with the focus heavily on pads, tampons and panty liners. Bring in these items in a purse or individually, whatever works for you!

These items will be provided to girls from Logan Elm, Circleville and New Hope schools. At the time, Terra actually spoke to each school administrator and got numbers from them and heard the needs of the school.

Collection sites are four of our local churches: Circleville First Church, Crossroads, Logan Elm Baptist and Heritage Nazarene. There will be a business card from every church that will go in every purse. We currently have 30 purses between all of the churches. If you need to buy a new purse with all of the items included it will roughly cost \$22-25.

The collection of the purses will run through **July 26.** When the purses are collected, they will be prayed over before distribution. There is a tub next to the decorated bulletin board in the overflow for you to place your purses with donations.



"I am really praying that God continues to move people's heart to serve and to help in any way they can! I AM SO EXCITED TO SEE WHAT JESUS WILL DO THROUGH THIS MINISTRY!" Terra concluded.

Please remember during this time of uncertainty in our world, Operation Christmas Child. Please pray for this ministry and as you come across small items that will fit in a shoebox, put them aside. Here are a few suggestions:

Toys that children will immediately embrace such as cars, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), dolls, stuffed animals, etc.





School supplies such as pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons, markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

Non-liquid hygiene items like toothbrushes, dental floss, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc.

Accessories and crafts such as T-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), hair bows, finger puppets, etc.

Other items such as tools, hammers, nails, screwdrivers, nuts, bolts, screws, soccer ball & air pump (must deflate).

Not Allowed: used or damaged items, war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; food of any type; toothpaste; candy; gum; chocolate; drink mixes (powdered or liquid); liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; aerosol cans.

The things children ask for the most are washcloths, soap and school supplies, believe it or not.
