# Comfy corner creations

This is a recipe that originally ran in the November 2013 issue of "The Witness". It is being run again with Vicki's permission. Thank you, Vicki!

I have been using fresh pumpkin puree for the past few days and since it is such an easy recipe, I thought I would share it with newsletter recipe readers. Once you make it, you can use it in any of your favorite recipes that calls for pumpkin puree.

### Pie Pumpkin Puree

Halve a baking pie pumpkin and roast at 350 degrees cut side down in  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch water until tender, about 45 minutes or until a



fork pierces easily into pumpkin. Scoop out and discard the seed and fiber, then scoop out the flesh and puree in a food processor. That's it! Enjoy!

# **Operation Christmas Child**

#### After you pick up a shoebox or two or more...Shoeboxes due October 11.

Decide whether to prepare a box for a boy or a girl, then what age group: 2-4 years; 5-9 years and 10-14 years. Simple, right?

What should I put in the box? The most important thing is **prayer.** Pray for the child, his family and every person who touches this box. Pray for the items you should place in the box.



Next place toys such as toy cars, yo-yos, jump ropes, balls, toys that light up and make noise (with extra batteries), dolls, stuffed animals, etc. Also school supplies such as pens, pencils and sharpeners, crayons,

markers, notebooks, paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc. You can include **non-liquid hygiene items** like toothbrushes, bar soap, combs, washcloths, etc. Accessories and crafts such as T-shirts, socks, hats, sunglasses, hair clips, jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries), hair bows, finger puppets, etc. Other items such as tools, hammers, nails, screwdrivers, nuts, bolts, screws, soccer ball & air pump (must deflate).

# The story behind the song

So Will I by Hillsong United

It has been a while since I have written an article. The song I am going to review is one of my favorite worship songs called *So Will I.* 



Written by a great songwriter and lyricist, Ben Hastings, the song was originally called *Artisan*. Then Joel Houston, a fabulous song writer himself and the head of the band

Hillsong United, took the song. Joel, as he does, took it and was like, "I feel like there's more to this. God wants to say more in the song".

So the song is a journey of creation and all the things in the world that were created by God and for God. Following along that line, the Bible talks about singing with creation. For us, reminding us, that we are a part of this journey of creation as well. We're all singing out this one song.

When the song says, 'if creation will sing, if the wind goes where you will send it, so will I', this is singing praises that people can really declare and speak out. People really shout it out. It's a confession, "I will sing as well; so will I. I was created to sing your worship, God". And a hundred billion failures left behind seems

to be the line where people go 'yeah!'



The song goes full circle. It goes

from creation to salvation. Ben describes the audience's reaction, as they sing the song. As they are reading the lyrics and figuring out the whole cycle then when it comes back around to 'a hundred billion failures disappear', you actually see people in the crowd going, "Aaah"! They are reading, processing and understanding. They're like, 'This is how I want to articulate the meaning of the song, but I didn't know it.'

### "So Will I (100 Billion X)"

God of creation There at the start, before the beginning of time With no point of reference You spoke to the dark and fleshed out the wonder of light

And as You speak

A hundred billion galaxies are born In the vapour of Your breath the planets form If the stars were made to worship, so will I I can see Your heart in everything You've made Every burning star, a signal fire of grace If creation sings Your praises, so will I
