# The God of the Mountains

## January 5 The Mountains of Israel & Mountains of God

Based upon Psalm 121:1-2; Mark 11:23; I Kings 19:9. 13. 15

## January 12 The Mount of Beginning

This session will examine the role of Mount Hermon in the creation narrative and before, seeking to understand what made Hermon a strategic spot for Peter's confession, "Thou art the Christ." The study is based upon Ezekiel 28:12-17; Revelation 12:3-9; Matthew 16: 13-20; Genesis 1:1-2; Isaiah 14:12-15.

#### January 19 The Mount of Beginning Again

Genesis 6,7,8 demonstrates the important role of Mount Ararat in the life of Noah and in the life of all of humanity.

#### January 26 The Mount of Obedience

Abraham's climb up Mount Moriah in Genesis 22:1-19 for the purpose of sacrificing Isaac reveals several lessons on the nature of obedience.

## February 9 The Mount of God's Call

After eighty years of preparation Moses became a mountain climber when he met God on Mount Horeb: The Mountain of God's Vocational Call (Exodus 3 and 4:1-18). That encounter led to a later trek up Mount Sinai: The Mount of God's Holiness Call (Exodus 19, 20).

## February 16 The Mount of Disappointment

At the Rephidim High Place (Exodus 17:8-16) Moses failed to trust God completely resulting in the greatest disappointment of his life on Mount Nebo (Deuteronomy 34:1-4; Numbers 20:2-11).

The story does not end until Moses' disappointment is alleviated on the Mount of Transfiguration (Mark 9:2-13).

## February 23 The Mount of Decision

On Mount Carmel Elijah challenged Israel saying, "How long will you go limping between two different Opinions? The same decision must be made by every individual today?

## March 2 The Mount of Temptation

On Mount Quarantania, the traditional site of the temptation of Jesus, He just said "no," to Satan, and demonstrated several undeniable spiritual realities in the process.

## March 9 The Mount of Spiritual Discipline

In Matthew 14:22-23 Jesus demonstrated four spiritual disciplines that remain vital to the development of his followers.

## March 16 The Mount of Transfiguration

Four supernatural events took place on Mount Tabor, the traditional site of the transfiguration. Where and Why the event took place is also revealing.

## March 23 The Mount of Redemption

No reference to a mountain called Calvary appears anywhere in Scripture, but all four gospels report the crucifixion of Jesus (Matthew 27: 32-50; Mark 15:21-37; Luke 23: 26-46; John 19:17-30) by recalling the words that He spoke from the cross.

## March 30 The Divided Mountain

The Mount of Olives has been/will be the site of four key events in the life of Jesus. From here he taught (Matthew 24), prayed (Matthew 26: 36-46), ascended (Acts 1:3-11), and will return (Zechariah 14:3-9).

#### For Discussion or Contemplation

- 1. Which of the mountains to be explored in this study most intrigues you? Why?
- 2. Elijah's personal place was on Mount Carmel, while on Sinai he was out of his element. Do you have a personal place? Why is it special?
- 3. Dr. Neff suggested it is possible to be "in grace" but in the wrong place. Do you agree or disagree? What evidence have you seen?

## The story behind the song Oceans

Recently, *Oceans* by Hillsong United has been running through my mind, specifically the line "Spirit lead me where my trust is

without borders." As I looked into the story behind the song and the scripture that inspired it (Matthew 14:22-26, Peter walking on the water) and thought what it really means to be led where my trust is without borders.

But what even is trust? How is it built? How is it broken? What characterizes it? According to Google, trust is defined as "firm belief in the reliability, truth, ability or strength of someone or something". Ok, so it involves a firm belief. That firm belief had to come from somewhere, whether the belief has been tested or has come from a source you trust. There is something tangible and known about trust.

Now what about those situations where there is no firm belief but there still is trust. Maybe that's where faith comes in. When you don't have the trust, but you must trust anyway. In that way, faith is like trust that can't be explained in a purely logical fashion. It's the sense that a person can do the job even though you have no proof of that.



Next in the song, is the idea of borders. In some ways it almost seems counter intuitive to have borders on trust. The very idea of

trust begs to be constantly changing as life progresses through our experiences. I hope that the more I experience life, the more resilient and more trusting I'll become, but sometimes my trust is built up and other times I am let down by people or things. I've built trust to a certain point so there is a literal border that trust doesn't exist outside of. But once again, there is something striking about trust without borders. And in my mind, faith is what fills the gap between my borders and trust without borders. What does it look like to live "where my trust is without borders." To stick with the song, my answer is..."Spirit lead me." When you invite the Holy Spirit to lead you, there is endless trust because your trust is not dependent on where you are being led or what you are being led to do.

To wrap this up, reflecting on the past year it seems like a lot of people were or are still going through rough situations and that *Oceans* should be our theme for our present lives in these times. It's pointed out that with most of us crying out the lyrics "Spirit

lead me where my trust is without borders", of course we should expect ourselves to end up in places where trust is necessary.




if you are interested. I purchase the tickets in advance to ensure our seats. Watch the church bulletin for motel prices and more information later this month.
