February 2 Avon Park Holiness Camp Meeting

February 9 The Mount of God's Call

After eighty years of preparation Moses became a mountain climber when he met God on Mount Horeb: The Mountain of God's Vocational Call (Exodus 3 and 4:1-18). That encounter led to a later trek up Mount Sinai: The Mount of God's Holiness Call (Exodus 19, 20).

February 16 The Mount of Disappointment

At the Rephidim High Place (Exodus 17:8-16) Moses failed to trust God completely resulting in the greatest disappointment of his life on Mount Nebo (Deuteronomy 34:1-4; Numbers 20:2-11). The story does not end until Moses' disappointment is alleviated on the Mount of Transfiguration (Mark 9:2-13).

February 23 The Mount of Decision

On Mount Carmel Elijah challenged Israel saying, "How long will you go limping between two different Opinions? The same decision must be made by every individual today?

March 2 The Mount of Temptation

On Mount Quarantania, the traditional site of the temptation of Jesus, He just said "no," to Satan, and demonstrated several undeniable spiritual realities in the process.

March 9 The Mount of Spiritual Discipline

In Matthew 14:22-23 Jesus demonstrated four spiritual disciplines that remain vital to the development of his followers.

March 16 The Mount of Transfiguration

Four supernatural events took place on Mount Tabor, the traditional site of the transfiguration. Where and Why the event took place is also revealing.

March 23 The Mount of Redemption

No reference to a mountain called Calvary appears anywhere in Scripture, but all four gospels report the crucifixion of Jesus (Matthew 27: 32-50; Mark 15:21-37; Luke 23: 26-46; John 19:17-30) by recalling the words that He spoke from the cross.

March 30 The Divided Mountain

The Mount of Olives has been/will be the site of four key events in the life of Jesus. From here he taught (Matthew 24), prayed (Matthew 26: 36-46), ascended (Acts 1:3-11), and will return (Zechariah 14:3-9).

Little Cheddar Meat Loaves

1 egg

³/₄ c. milk
1 c. shredded cheddar cheese
¹/₂ c. quick cooking oats
¹/₂ c. chopped onions
1 t. salt
1 lb. ground beef
2/3 c. ketchup
¹/₂ c. brown sugar
1 ¹/₂ t. prepared mustard



Beat egg and milk. Stir in cheese, oats, onions and salt. Add beef. Mix well. Shape into 8 loaves. Place in greased 13x9 baking dish. Combine ketchup, brown sugar and mustard. Spoon over loaves. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for 45 minutes.
