As I searched for a recipe, I came across a cookbook written by Mrs. Mollie Hedges' third grade class at Atwater Elementary, December 1994. Each student submitted a recipe, the cookbook was compiled and dedicated to their parents.

Bradney's Best Bravo Mississippi Mud Cake

1 c. oil

1 ³/₄ c. sugar

4 eggs

1 ½ c. flour

1/3 c. cocoa

3 T. vanilla

1 c. chopped nuts miniature marshmallows



Mix oil and sugar. Add eggs, one at a time, beating after each. Add flour and cocoa; then vanilla and nuts. Stir well. Bake 300 degrees for 30-35 minutes in a greased and floured 9x13x2 pan. After baking is finished, turn off oven, cover top of cake with marshmallows. Set cake in oven with door slightly open, while making the icing.

Icing:

Mix 1/3 cup cocoa and one (1) pound powdered sugar. Add 1 ½ sticks melted margarine, 1 tablespoon vanilla and ½ cup evaporated milk. Pour over cake and swirl through softened marshmallows.
