

Kitchen delights

Since it is still winter, soup always tastes good when it's cold.

Quick & Easy Chicken Noodle Soup

1 Tbsp. butter
1/2 cup of chopped onion
1/2 cup of chopped celery
4 (14.5 oz.) cans chicken broth
1 (14.5 oz.) can vegetable broth
1/2 pound chopped cooked chicken breast
1 1/2 cups egg noodles
1 cup sliced carrots
1/2 tsp. dried basil
1/2 tsp. dried oregano
Salt and pepper to taste



Melt butter in a large pot over medium heat. Add onion and celery and cook until just tender, 5-7 minutes. Add chicken broth, vegetable broth, chicken, egg noodles, carrots, basil, oregano, salt, and pepper. Stir to combine and bring to a boil.

Reduce heat and simmer for 20 minutes.


