Kitchen delights

The holidays are coming, ready or not! Here is a unique recipe to make using cranberries.

Baked Cranberry Sauce

- 4 cups fresh cranberries, rinsed and drained
- 2 cups sugar
- 2 Tablespoons water



Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Combine all ingredients in a 1-1/2-quart casserole dish. Cover and bake 50 to 60 minutes, stirring occasionally, until the cranberries pop. Let cool slightly then cover and chill until ready to serve.

NOTE: One 12-ounce bag of cranberries measures about 3 cups.

Apple Marshmallows Mouths



16 apple slices - large apple, any variety 4 Tbsp. peanut butter or almond butter 1 cup mini marshmallows

Slice the apple into an even number of slices. One large apple can provide about 16 slices. To keep apples from turning, soak slices in 1 tsp. salt in 2 cups of water for 10 minutes; then rinse and pat dry.

Spread a thin layer of peanut butter on the top side of each apple slice.

Add a single layer of mini marshmallows to the top of an apple slice, using the peanut butter to hold mini marshmallows in

place. Place an apple slice on top of the marshmallows, peanut butter side down, to complete each apple 'mouth'. Yum, yum!!
