

Children dedicated



Pricing and scheduling are in the works at this time.





Kitchen delights

These can be used for almost any occasions and are fun to make:

MASONJAR COOKIES

Sand Art Cookies

1/2 cup white sugar

1/2 cup rolled oats

1/2 cup candy-coated chocolate pieces (M&M's)

1/2 cup packed brown sugar

1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup crisp rice cereal

1/2 cup semisweet chocolate chips



In a quart or 1 liter jar, layer the ingredients in the order given. Lightly pack down the jar after each addition.

Attach a card with the following instructions:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a cookie sheet. Empty the entire contents of the jar into a medium bowl. Add 1 large egg and 1/2 cup of margarine melted; mix well. Form dough into 1-inch balls and bake for 10 to 12 minutes in the preheated oven. Makes about 2 dozen cookies.

Best Ever Chocolate Chip Cookies



1 2/3 cups all-purpose flour 3/4 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 cup white sugar 2 cups semisweet chocolate chips 1/2 cup packed brown sugar

Combine the flour, baking soda, white sugar and the chocolate chips. Place 1/2 of the mixture in a clean quart sized glass jar and pack firmly. Place the brown sugar on top, again packing firmly. Place the remaining flour mixture on top. Cover with lid.

Attach an index card with the following directions:

Empty contents of jar into a large bowl. In separate bowl combine 3/4 cup of butter, 2 eggs and 1 teaspoon vanilla. Beat until creamy. Add to dry mixture. Drop by tablespoonful onto an ungreased cookie sheet and bake

in a preheated 375 degrees oven for 8 - 10 minutes. Makes about 2 dozen cookies.


Annual Chili Cook-Off




